

How do I charge a lead-acid battery?

Can a lead acid battery be charged at a full charge?

Test show that a healthy lead acid battery can be charged at up to 1.5C as long as the current is moderated towards a full charge when the battery reaches about 2.3V/cell(14.0V with 6 cells). Charge acceptance is highest when SoC is low and diminishes as the battery fills.

What happens if you don't recharge a lead-acid battery?

Even in storage, lead-acid batteries naturally lose charge over time, and failure to periodically recharge them can result in irreversible damage. 8. How often should you charge a lead acid battery?

Charge your battery at least every 6 months when it's in storage. When stored at 20 °C (68 °F), your lead acid battery will lose about 3 percent of its capacity per month. If you store your battery for a long period without charging it, especially at temperatures higher than 20 °C (68 °F), it may experience a permanent loss of capacity.
