Do I need planning permission to install solar panels?

However, make sure you follow all building regulations and apply for planning permission if necessary, as your neighbour could report your installation to the local authority if you don't - which could result in your panels having to come down.

Can you put solar panels on a building?

Yes, if the installation falls under permitted development. However, if you live in a conservation area or world heritage site you can't put solar panels on the principal or side elevation walls of your house if it fronts a highway. This would require a planning application. Are there restrictions for solar panels on a listed building?

What should I do if my neighbours oppose solar panels?

The first step in addressing any objections is to talk to your neighbours and try to understand their concerns. Some common concerns that neighbours may have about solar panel installations include: Visual impact: Neighbours may be concerned that the solar panels will be unsightly and reduce the aesthetic appeal of the neighbourhood.

Can I install solar panels if I don't meet building regulations?

Your local authority can also apply for a Confiscation Order to take away any money you've earned with your system - so there's absolutely no benefit to installing solar panels that don't meet building regulations. It's crucial that your solar installation follows all building regulations.

Can solar panels be installed on a listed building?

The solar panels must not be installed on a building that is a listed building, unless the panels are flush with the roof or integrated into the roof covering. If your solar panel installation falls within these parameters, your neighbours won't have any grounds to object.
